Dear Supporter

Welcome to this first newsletter of the new year, and the new decade, which is a good time to reflect on what has passed, and also on plans for the coming year.



Some of our highlights are m e n t i o n e d overleaf, but we have also been reflecting on the future and what must be done

and what would be the right way forward.

A recent "Which?" Report (January 2020 by Neil Higgins) stated that in 2019 the average cost of a residential care home increased to £33,852 a year, up from £25,012 in 2010, an increase of almost 5%, the largest increase in 10 years. And the average cost of a nursing home in 2018-19 was £46,436 a year - a 4.3% rise on the previous year.

We therefore feel that we should continue with our current policy of building small communities of independent living apartments. The housing industry predicts that 30,000 retirement homes are needed every year for the next 10 years, to meet estimated demand. Our long term aim is to achieve a self-sustaining model which is not totally reliant upon subscriptions and donations.

As you may be aware, we recently undertook a survey to ascertain what potential buyers would be looking for in another development. Our survey showed that 82% would be looking to purchase, and 18% to rent. The majority, 84%, would prefer a 2 bedroom apartment, and 16% would prefer a 1 bedroom apartment.

We also asked the question, "Where would you like to see a site?" The answers are shown here.

- Along South Coast (within distance) 36%
- Mid Kent 32%
- East/West Midlands 19%/5%
- West Country/Dorset 4%
- East Anglia 4%

The main preferences in a development are as follows -

- Places of worship in the vicinity
- Within walking distance of local amenities
- Garden space
- Access to public transport

Our mission now is to find the next site. An agent has been tasked with looking for potential sites in the South Coast, Mid Kent, Mid Sussex and Surrey. The ideal site size is at least 0.6 acre.



However, we also want to work together with your eyes and ears to find a suitable location. (This is how we found out about the site in Tunbridge Wells.) Please do contact with us any information! The Trustees really appreciate all the help vou have
